- We are required to test 500 items from death scenes.
- Medical Investigations have collected drugs and/or paraphernalia at 40 scenes since starting project December 1.
- Criminalistics Supervisor is overseeing hiring/training of new chemist in Drug ID, the purchase of a new GC-MS, and the validation of the GC-MS.
- Criminalistics Supervisor has tested 128 items.
