On the recommendation of Britt Rosencutter, on behalf of various county departments, Tim Myers moved to accept the contract modification for Waste Connections of Kansas, Inc. for an additional 4% overall increase. Brandi Baily seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

This third increase request is for an additional 4%, which brings the total increase for this contract to 16%.

Waste Connections of Kansas, Inc. is enacting a rate increase due to a significant increase in diesel fuel, labor cost, and other operating costs.

Notes:

This is the final renewal for this contract, which ends September 30, 2025. It will go out for bid next year. The approximate annual spend for 2023 was \$240,860.22.

Change Order #2 (August 16, 2023)

This second increase request is for 5%, which brings the total increase for this contract to 12%. Any cumulative increase of over 10% requires Board of Bids and Contracts and Board of County Commission approval.

Change Order #1 (July 13, 2022)

An increase of 7% was handled as an administrative change order as it was less than 10%. The approximate annual spend for 2022 was \$219,511.77.

Questions and Answers

Russell Leeds: We're into the final year of this contract?

Britt Rosencutter: Correct.

Russell Leeds: It ends September 30, 2025?

Britt Rosencutter: Yes. So we'll put it back out for bid probably early summer.

Russell Leeds: Was this contract constructed in a way that acknowledged there were going to be annual increases or how is it that they're bringing increases to us in the midst of a contract?

Joe Thomas: Yes. We did not lock in any firm pricing based on the previous years dealing with both trash service vendors, knowing there would be some increases but we generally make sure that they're not exorbitant. It is usually connected to some significant reason which we felt these were substantiated.

Russell Leeds: Okay. So the contract was written in a way that we didn't have locked in pricing for three (3) years.

Joe Thomas: Exactly.

Russell Leeds: It was written in that they could come to us with reasonable cost of doing business increases.

Joe Thomas: Right. If we had told them lock in for three (3) years, we would have got a lot higher price based on their hedging for anticipated increases, opposed to substantiating each years proposed increased costs. If they did it at the beginning we thought they'd be guessing that okay, in three (3) years, how much pricing would go up. So let's mishedge by getting these prices higher by certain percentage. Hope I explained that correctly. We usually have a firm one (1) year price and then evaluate each renewal year. We allow them, if there's good reasons for it, to have an increase.

Russell Leeds: That's how this was constructed? The firm one year?

Joe Thomas: Yes.

Russell Leeds: Then annual renewals thereafter?

Joe Thomas: Yes. That's how this is.

Russell Leeds: So this is a one (1) year with a certain number of year options to renew?

Joe Thomas: Yes.

Russell Leeds: We've opted to renew another year with price increase.

Joe Thomas: Yes, sir.

Brandi Baily: This particular contract was only written to allow for price increases each year. So if we're going to go out to bid next year for this, can we maybe consider taking into account writing that contract where maybe there's a maximum increase and then if we hit that maximum increase then we could go out to bid for them, we could opt to continue?

Joe Thomas: It would be kind of hard for us to set a maximum increase. So we are in a inflationary market, we say, hey, let's set this maximum increase, but we may be way overestimating any increase. I just don't think we can come up with an accurate number do you Britt?

Britt Rosencutter: I don't see how. This contract started during Covid, so I'm sure that that had some effect on pricing.

Joe Thomas: Based on any maximum increase given, the vendor will hedge on their pricing to compensate for it. There will still be competitive pricing, since there are two (2) major vendors involved, Waste Management and Waste Connections.

Britt Rosencutter. I think those are the only two (2) that bid, if I remember correctly.

Brandi Baily: So if this was only a one (1) year contract and then we have the options to renew and we're working on the options to renew piece, how come we haven't thought about going out to bid prior to doing the options to renew?

Joe Thomas: Because if you go out for bid you are not guaranteed to get a more competitive price than what is being asked for including the incremental increase. If it's an exorbitant increase then we'll go back out for bid again. If it seems to be reasonable, based on the Consumer Price Index or a reasonable increase, we have the right to accept that increase.

Brandi Baily: I guess 4% is not bad. I think it's just the overall 16%.

Joe Thomas: Here's how it went. If you look at the notes, the first one was 7% then the second was 5%, which made it 12%, and then this final increase was 4% which is considered reasonable.

Britt Rosencutter: If I remember correctly, on the first increase we did negotiate because they wanted more than 7% and we held them to 7%.

Russell Leeds: On this contract, did we award to more than one (1) vendor at that time or do we have more than one (1) vendor for trash service?

Joe Thomas: We just had the one (1).

Britt Rosencutter: That's correct.

Russell Leeds: Alright. You said something a minute ago that made me think maybe we had two (2).

Joe Thomas: When we go out for bid, we usually get two (2) back on this type of service. It's Waste Connections and Waste Management. In that case, we chose Waste Connections.
