On the recommendation of Tammy Cully, on behalf of the Department of Corrections, Tim Myers moved to **accept the quote from Motorola Solutions in the amount of \$267,460.92**. Jennifer Blasi seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

In a correctional setting, effective communication is paramount for maintaining safety and order. Radios are indispensable tools that enable correctional officers to communicate swiftly and efficiently across the facility. They are used to coordinate responses to incidents, relay important information, and ensure that all staff members are aware of ongoing situations. Real-time communication is crucial to maintaining safety and security within the facility while also preventing/managing emergencies, altercations, medical emergencies, and possible security breaches.

The current radios in use are over 10 years old, which poses several significant issues. Technology has advanced considerably in the past decade and older radios may lack the features and reliability of newer models. Furthermore, most of the current radios being used are no longer serviceable and have failed during emergency situations. Therefore, it is crucial that the facility radios be upgraded to newer equipment that provides enhanced clarity, better range and more robust security features, which is essential in high-stakes correctional settings.

Investing in new radios is an investment in the safety and effectiveness of the correctional facility. The new radios will ensure officers have the best tools available to respond to safety and security issues within the facility.

On the recommendation of Lee Barrier, on behalf of Metropolitan Area Building and Construction Department (MABCD), Anna Meyerhoff-Cole moved to **accept the quote from Avolve Software Corporation (Avolve) in the amount of \$65,352.00**. Tim Myers seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

ProjectDox is a building plan/blueprint review software system provided by the company Avolve. MABCD has a current software licensing and service contract with Avolve, and utilizes ProjectDox as the source for all functions related to Commercial Plan Review and the approval of projects for commercial building permits. As of 2019, MABCD mandates that all projects be submitted and reviewed electronically in order to save staff and industry resources. The review of commercial projects prior to commencement of construction serves a vital role in ensuring code compliance and public safety. Several Sedgwick County and City of Wichita agencies provide their portion of a project review and approval through ProjectDox. All costs associated with this process are funded through permit fees charged to customers for these services.

Currently, MABCD utilizes version 9.2 of this software. The department elected to delay an upgrade to the 9.3 version last year in order to defer cost while determining longer term requirements and goals for software usage. The vendor is now offering software version 9.4, and the department has determined features of this current offering will be required to maintain current service levels and provide for future requirements, which include the addition of two (2) new jurisdictions utilizing MABCD for plan review services. Accommodating required changes from the 9.3 upgrade in the same transaction as completing the 9.4 upgrade will be the most timely and cost effective.

**Questions and Answers**

Anna Meyerhoff-Cole: So this is the just the cost for the upgrade. Are there other costs that we pay annually for licensure?

Chris Labrum: Yes we do. We pay annual service fees and maintenance fees. So those will not change with this. There is a service and maintenance fee associated with the upgrade but that's just to get it online. Any required training, etc, to be in place and then it just goes back with our standing contract.

Anna Meyerhoff-Cole: So just to summarize what you said, there are the costs associated with the upgrade but it won't increase any of our ongoing annual costs?

Chris Labrum: Correct. It does not change the current contract.
