- During the month of August Sedgwick County Developmental Disability Organization (SCDDO) Quality Assurance Staff completed 5 day and 12 residential program visits.
- The Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities Advisory Board reviewed and approved the initial application for three new providers at their August 13th meeting. The two residential agencies are currently in the process of licensure; however, All Saints Home Care has completed affiliation for self-directed services.
- The County Commission recognized the Sedgwick County Project SEARCH program for achieving 100% employment for the 2023 class. Project SEARCH is a workforce development program that pairs a school district with a business to provide job training for students with intellectual/developmental disabilities. Chris Nichols, Project SEARCH Teacher, and Haley Anderson, Employment Specialist with Kansas Vocational Rehabilitation, were recognized by the Commission for their work. Natalie Bush, Project SEARCH Skills Trainer, is no longer with the program but was an important part of its success.
