On the recommendation of Lee Barrier, on behalf of the Department of Corrections, Philip Davolt moved to accept the proposals from Cherry Creek Treatment Center, Kansas Department for Children and Families dba DCF, and TFI Family Services, Inc. Anna Meyerhoff-Cole seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

A committee comprised of Lesa Lank, Julee Meslin, Kevin Cocking, and Jessica Christian - Department of Corrections; Delores Craig-Moreland, Ph.D. WSU Consultant; and Britt Rosencutter - Purchasing evaluated all proposal responses based on the criteria set forth in the RFP. The committee agreed unanimously to accept the proposals as stated above.

The Kansas Department of Corrections provides funding for evidence-based practices and programs in the community based on needs identified by the Sedgwick County Juvenile Corrections Advisory Board (JCAB) Team Justice. This RFP to allocate SFY26 funding, which covers the period from 7/1/25 - 6/30/27, offered programs the option to include a supplemental request utilizing unexpended SFY24 funds for the period from 2/1/25 - 6/30/25. All allocations and contracts are contingent on funding awarded by Kansas Department of Corrections.

The proposal from Cherry Creek Treatment Center for \$243,192.54 to provide comprehensive treatment services for adolescents experiencing substance use disorders was selected and funded. The supplemental request for \$240,834.70 for costs related to establishing services was selected and funded at the full amount requested.

The proposal from Kansas Department of Children and Families dba DCF for \$158,528.00 to provide Crossover Youth Program services for youth who are dually involved with the DCF system, was selected and funded at the full amount requested.

The proposal from TFI Family Services, Inc. for \$300,000.00 to provide evidence-based intensive family intervention services was selected and funded at the full amount requested.

## **Questions and Answers**

Brandi Baily: In here, you say the RFP is for State Fiscal Year 2026 and you have the dates 7/1/25 - 6/30/27. So is it covering 2026 and 2027 or is it just covering 2026?

Lee Barrier: It's covering through 2027.

Anna Meyerhoff-Cole: Can you expand on the supplemental request for \$240,000.00 that's to establish services because it's almost the same amount as just providing the service for a much longer period of time. So what all is contained in establishing the services?

Mario Salinas: So the provider has a spot that's currently being utilized for other services. In order for them to prepare that space for the juvenile population, and to be licensed by Department of Children and Families, they have to have the facility upgraded with certain features so that's the start up cost and bought with the unexpended funds from the current State Fiscal Year.

Tim Kaufman: Thank you. I'm not familiar with Cherry Creek Treatment. Is that here in town?

Mario Salinas: My understanding is it's here in town. I don't know the exact location. They serve boys and girls ages 12-18 for inpatient substance abuse and educational services.
