


Ten (10) cases were received May-July 2024 while analysts were in training; training was completed and cases were cleared.





Quarterly Summary:

- Both LC-MS/MS instrument validations continuing and entering into our final year of Coverdell funded outsourcing in Tox.
- Land acquisition for DNA addition is on hold space study is completed, cost estimation underway.
- Staffing has remained fairly stable, a second fully trained Firearms Examiner was on-boarded August 19, 2024
- Laboratory staff spent 2 weeks performing an internal audit to prepare for our ANAB surveillance assessment.
- The ANAB surveillance audit resulted in no findings of non-conformity.


Quarterly Summary OD2A:

- OD2A funded position is testing drugs and paraphernalia from scenes, data sharing with CDC has begun.
- Medical Investigations have collected drugs and/or paraphernalia at 110 scenes since starting project December 1, 2023.
- Drug paraphernalia testing is caught up (717 items), some technical reviews of data ongoing (~19 cases).
- Results are posted on RFSC website.
- Have begun Year 2 expenditures under this grant and plan to attend the CDC OD2A meeting in Atlanta this spring.


